# You Are Accepted and Registered! Now What?

- 1. Check the email account you listed on your application frequently for updates once you have submitted all required documents to your college of choice.
- 2. The college will send you an email confirming they received your application. This is NOT the same as being admitted! Check your email for your admissions notification.
- 3. Once you receive an admissions notification, you should also receive instructions on setting up your college email. Do this ASAP! Emails regarding scheduling a time to meet with your college advisor and enrolling in your course(s) will be sent to your college email, not the personal one used when you initially applied for admission.
- 4. Once the college registers/enrolls you in the agreed upon courses, send your JHS Counselor a copy of your college schedule. You can forward the email or send a snapshot. Your JHS schedule will not be adjusted until you send proof of your schedule.
- 5. Complete the online or attend the in-person orientation as required by your college. Many online classes will NOT be accessible until you complete this. Do not wait until the first day of the semester, as you won't be able to access your class on the first day, putting you behind in your work.
- 6. Review emails for tech support if you have issues with logins, password, or access. You must contact the college if you have issues or questions.
- 7. Access any online class on the FIRST DAY to prevent being dropped as a no-show.
